Messages in Time and Location in the Day of Atonement

<i>Message (Reference)</i>	<i>Began (Reference)</i>	<i>Initial Understanding</i>	<i>Relation to Most Holy Place</i>	
First Angel's Message (Revelation 14:6, 7)	1831 (GC 330.2; 368.1)	"The hour of His judgment" pointed to the Second Coming	Based on the time prophecy of Daniel 8:14, this should have pointed people first to the Most Holy Place where Jesus was soon to go.	Preparing people to follow Jesus into the Most Holy Place.
Second Angel's Message (Revelation 14:8)	Summer 1844 (GC 389.2)	The churches who rejected the Advent message experienced a fall	Babylon is the code word for the fourth kingdom of Daniel in its final amalgamated form, with a corrupted religious core, whose "Most-Holy-Place" verdict is "fallen."	
Midnight Cry (Matthew 25:1-13)	Late Summer 1844 (GC 398.3)	The bridegroom's coming was the Second Coming	The foolish virgins will not be prepared to follow the Bridegroom into the Most Holy Place where the wedding takes place. ¹	
<i>"The passing of the time"--Beginning of Antitypical Day of Atonement</i>				
Third Angel's Message (Revelation 14:9-12)	After October 22, 1844 (EW 254.1)	This was the first message <i>from</i> the Most Holy Place	While the warning is about the consequence of false worship, the positive burden of the message is one that unites law and gospel in a message of justification by faith (blood on the mercy seat). ²	Inviting people to Jesus within the Most Holy Place.
Laodicean Message (Revelation 3:14-22)	Early 1850's (RH June 10, 1852 EGW; RH October 9, 1856 JW ³)	"... this message would end in the loud cry of the third angel." ⁴	This message prepares people for the latter rain. ⁵ This parallels Isaiah 6 and Romans 7, and is instruction from the Holy of Holies. ⁶	
Loud Cry (Revelation 18:1-5)	By 1892; (1888 1073.7)	"light yet to shine forth from the law of God and the gospel of righteousness" ⁷	Latter rain prepares for loud cry, ⁸ time of trouble, ⁹ and translation. ¹⁰ Loud cry began in message of "the righteousness of Christ." ¹¹ Final message from Most Holy Place.	

The above is the Advent Movement history and mission, followed by--

Close of Probation -- Time of Trouble / Seven Last Plagues -- Second Coming -- Millennium -- Final Judgment = *End of Antitypical Day of Atonement* (see RH, May 18, 1905 par. 10; GC 419-422)
